LOCAL MISSION: The Los Angeles Chapter seeks to improve our communities with direct assistance programs, promote the qualities of higher education through scholarships and support the Southwest California Synod and the ELCA with its special agency appeals.

MISSION IN ACTION

The 2024 program year began by coordinating and co-hosting with the Southwest California Synod, the 44th tribute to The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. This year's Commemoration and Celebration Worship Service was held on the campus of California Lutheran University (CLU), an affiliate of ADLA!

The Rev. Dr. Wyvetta Bullock, Associate to the Bishop Metro Chicago Synod (and former Executive for Administration, ELCA) served as the keynote speaker – The Preacher of the Hour! This is the 9th consecutive year in which ADLA – Los Angeles has facilitated this synod-wide worship event, which remains the 2nd highest attended synod annual event (whether in-person or virtual). The theme for this year was derived from John 18: 37-38: "What is Truth?"

A gift of \$1,600 was presented to ELCA Fund for Leaders – Federal Chaplaincy Ministries from offerings received. This offering supports ministerial care directed by those who serve this nation through military service. Our Synod and ADLA have received Medallion Donor status as a consequence. Last year, Federal Chaplaincy representatives acknowledged ADLA for its contributions during the 2023 Synod Assembly in Thousand Oaks. Total distributed offerings to all recipients amounted to \$20,294.09.

The month of February triggered ADLA – LA's involvement once again as co-host with CLU in coordinating its preaching series and musical accompaniment for its 5-week Black History Month celebration. These worship services have been growing week by week with students who are finding joy and togetherness in the "Beloved Community".

The Beloved Community can also be found as part of our Synod Chapel services. The Chapel is named and dedicated in honor of The Rev. Dr. Nelson W. Trout (former ALC South Pacific District Bishop). ADLA-LA continues to raise funds with a goal of \$25,000 in support of an endowment created to aid seminarians wishing to work in the inner city, like Dr. Trout. Contributions received to date approximate \$9,000. Many of these seminarians are likely to be trained at PLTS.

CLU and The Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary (PLTS) are valued agency affiliates of ADLA whose assistance helps further ADLA's vision!

ADLA - LOS ANGELES' COMMITMENT TO MINISTRY

Outreach to the Community

- 9th Year hosting God's Work, Our Hands Sunday providing hygiene and personal care kits to the un-housed on Skid Row, Los Angeles in partnership with Church of the Nazarene, L.A., along with area mobile home sites. Between 500-600 kits are distributed each year. Each kit cost approximately \$20.00.
- Sth Year supporting Bibles of Hope providing recovery bibles for inmates in concert with Hope Lutheran Church. \$2,000. This service has been discontinued and a new outlet is being sought.
- 9th Year contributing to The Ronald McDonald House, Long Beach offering aluminum pull-tabs collected to help defray the costs of family support to children with chronic illnesses. 116 pounds of pull-tabs submitted. 1,238 tabs per pound.
- 6th Year of network support to My Friends House, Inc. (501C3) Food Distribution and Nutritional Center, Los Angeles. 9,360 family units, consisting of 2-4 members served.
 1,040 volunteer hours, annually. Adopted California State University, Dominquez Hills and Southwest Community College in support of its food pantry and those students that are without permanent shelter. A monthly provision of staples and requested commodities occurs.
- 5th School Year Backpack Giveaway for desiring students entering the new school year. Up to 1,300 backpacks with school supplies have been distributed.

Sponsored Services and Scholarships

- Source States States Contributed States of the ELCA Robinson/Conway scholarship for seminarians of color.
- Source of the ELCA Daniel Payne Scholarship.
- Solution Stablished and contributed to the ELCA Rev. Dr. Nelson W. Trout Endowment \$9,000.
- Contributes annually to California Lutheran University and Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary at \$100 respectively each year. Total contribution \$400.

Total distributed offerings to all recipients amounted to \$13,800.

Worship and Praise – Evangelism and Outreach

- Planned and managed the annual Synod tribute to Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (2015-24).
- $\ensuremath{\boxtimes}$ Coordinated and produced the virtual 2022 Lenten Journey, involving the ADLA congregations.
- ☑ Identified and coordinated the preaching series and musical accompaniment for the CLU 4/5-week tribute to Black History (2023 & 2024).
- Maintained a collection of virtual worship experiences on the ADLA website for continuous review and comment. Up to 1,000+ hits annually.
- Established cohort (age group) ministries among member congregations. Bringing together - through selected events - members by age category to enhance familiarity and to garner a "brotherhood and sisterhood" among those in attendance. Special emphases have been on those 22-39 years of age!
- ⅔ Inter-congregational collaboration in communication and information sharing. Intentional support of other planned events by ADLA members.

Ecumenical Relations

Third year coordinating and joining with the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles in sponsoring a Night at Dodgers Stadium with 400+ Lutheran and 800+ Episcopalians in attendance. This fellowship has also been a way of bringing SWCA Synod congregational across the 9 conferences together as Lutherans! ADLA – LA serves as a partner with the Southwest California Synod it this activity's coordination.
